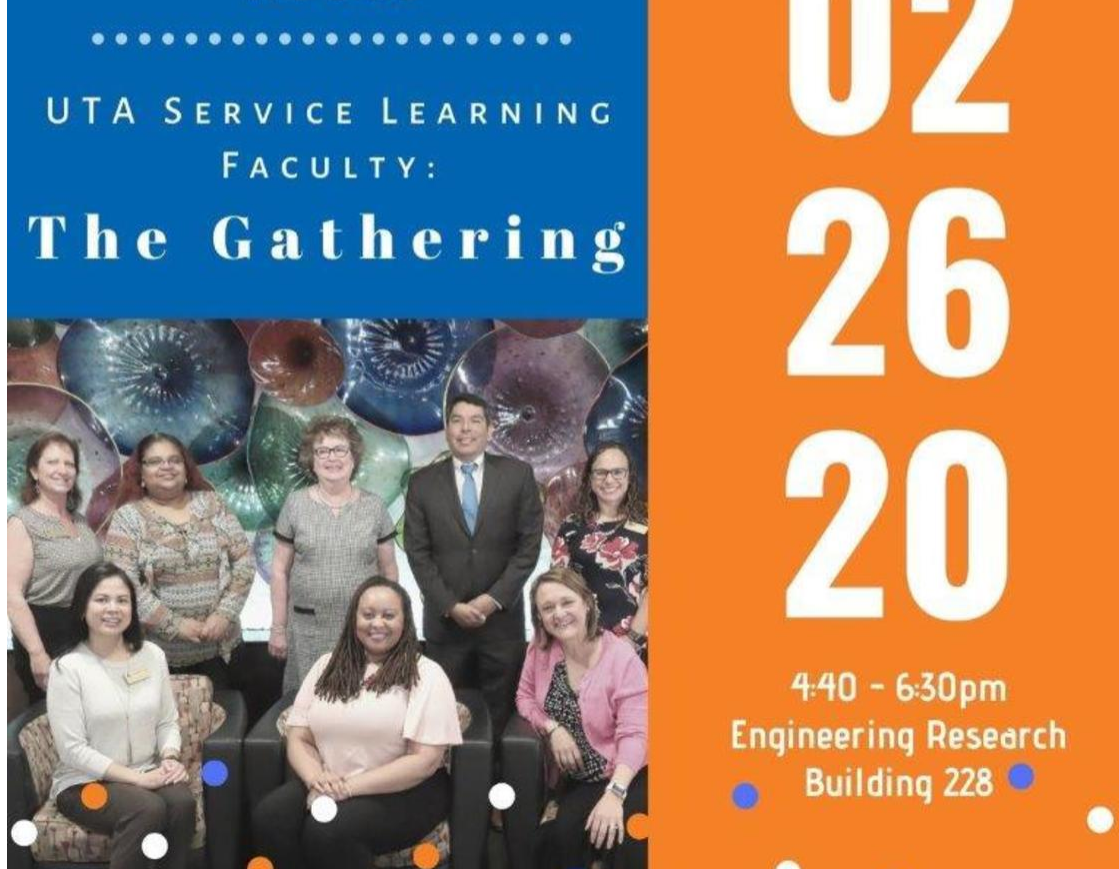
III. Innovative Teaching and Research-based Practices

ALLY has features for both instructors and students. Ally will scan a course in Canvas and provide guidance to instructors on how to improve and correct accessibility issues with their digital course content. Ally will also automatically generate "alternative formats" of course files and make them available to instructors and students. **This allows all users to choose a version of the file most appropriate for their device and need.**
