Here are just a few requests we have received from our own UTA students:

- 1. Please respond as quickly as possible to our emails and/or let us know the time frame we can expect to receive a response so we don't worry or keep emailing, e.g. within 48 hours.
- 2. Please provide clear and detailed instructions for assignments so we fully understand the 3. Please know we may be suddenly home-schooling our children, may have lost our jobs or
- now have to work odd hours, may not have strong internet, may be sharing a computer with others in the home, and are learning to navigate online courses too. 4. When teaching live please also record your sessions, check that your voice is not muffled or
- too close to the microphone, and turn on captions so we can read what is being said.
- 5. If teaching live, please do not change class meeting times because we may have other courses or obligations that conflict. Even if class is at the same time as on campus meetings, we may have conflicts now that we did not have before. Recorded class sessions (asynchronous) are always best.
- 6. Please do not only post notes and Power Points for us to read and work through ourselves. We need your feedback, need to ask questions, and need the human interaction we miss in our on campus courses.
