Call to Order: Jackie Fay (2:30 P.M.)

- 2:33 P.M. President Lim: Jeff Nyland will convert student chambers into hybrid so that the room can accommodate both online and in person meetings.
- UTA is now Texas Teir 1, which is something that we all should be proud of. Both past and present presidents, faculty and staff made this possible. UTA is only the 4th institutions to make this happen.

We will use Envore funding for research and partnerships in order to attract more stellar faculty to UTA.

- Fall is off to a good start. As of Sept. 20th, in person and on campus activities and courses will resume. We will follow CDC guidelines and best practices
- 2:40 P.M. Dr. Aswath: Large amount of COVID testing is occurring. A total of 16,000, with 10K being students as of last week. Heard from a number of faculty who are ready to go back to in person instruction. Can start as early as Sept. 13.
- As of Sept. 20th we will have normal in person instruction. We encourage faculty to let their students know when they are going back to in person as soon as possible. Faculty who have need special accommodations, we encourage you to make those requests. Some have been granted, some denied.
- We will continue to monitor the situation on campus and in neighborhoods and adjust. We want to give students the best opportunity to succeed.
- Faculty Senator: What is the exact criteria for the positivity rate that you are using to determine if we should switch back to in person? Right now the positivity rate is just over 1%? How high does it have to be to go online? Is testing optional? Hybrid and flip-flopping isn't working well for myself and colleagues. Some students want to be online, while others in person. This makes it difficult to plan classes ahead.
- Dr. Aswath: Don't have a set number of positivity rate. Look at what happens on the ground. If cases are mild and symptomatic. Consulting with chief health officer and public health officials. We have not looked at a set number of positivity rates, because positivity rates are based upon the number of people being tested as well as who is symptomatic/asymptomatic. Therefore those rates can vary. They are looking at risk and broader factors. Have heard from students and faculty. Students want face to face while faculty want online.
- Faculty Senator: What are the safety measures are you putting in place so that we can safely return in person?
- President Lim: Barriers between students and instructors, cleaning and rolling out incentives for vaccinations. We are also encouraging mask wearing. Set up contact tracing when someone tests positive. We have converted buildings into single pass. If there is anything you want us to do, let us know.
- Kaushik: UT Austin measure vaccination rate on campus. If 60% or higher, continue random testing. 80% vaccination rate, then symptomatic testing.

President Lim: Goal is to keep the campus healthy and safe. CDC guidelines keep changing. UTA has been successful. Many factors to take into account.

Provost Aswath: We need to look at institution risk, local risk and classroom. These factors can be very different. We are looking at it from various aspects.

Comment in chat: Some students don't want to come in person. Should we force them to come in person or deliver in person and online?

Provost Aswath: Students can request accommodations. Up to faculty. No need to mandate what faculty should do. It is faculty perogative to a certain extent.

Faculty Senator: This is in reference to UTA mandatory COVID testing. What if a colleague is off campus and cannot use UTA campus sites? Difficulty uploading information to site. Worried about sanctions and getting into trouble.

President Lim: Faculty can test off campus, but we are willing to work with them. The key is that we want to test enough people to get ahead of the delta variant. The point is not to punish faculty.

Faculty Senator: What do we tell faculty?

President Lim: Just tell them to test when they come back. The goal is to get ahead of the curve.

Faculty Senator: How are we tracking who comes on and off campus and who gets tested? What happens if people refuse or don't want to get tested?

President Lim: Goal is to keep one another safe and be a part of the testing program. We will work with you. We want this to be as easy as possible. The objective is to be ahead of the curve.

Faculty Senator: There seems to be confusion about Curative and their message about testing versus the facts. They commented that Sept. 8 (Today) the last day to get tested, when testing iis ongoing.

Provost Aswath: We will post an accurate statement about vaccinations.

3:12 P.M. Toni Sol, T& P was launched, 12 people coming up for tenure and promotion. 25 up for full with a total of 37. Working on NTT promotion flows. Will be talking to the deans about this. Will offer sessions for faculty who want to do this.

Senate Orientation:

We have over 30 new senators.

Dr. Fay has a Faculty Senate Handbook, which will be available very soon.

Important factor for Faculty Senate:

- Senators are conduits of information to their departments/units and communicate back to the senate any issues/concerns.
- You can take your own notes to relay information from senate. The minutes are on a 4 week cycle. It isn't designed to be swift relay of information. It is designed to have a permanent record of what happens in faculty senate.
- Being able to attend meetings is extremely important. If you can't attend meetings on a regular basis, Please consider allowing your unit to elect someone else.
- We have committees that are elected and committees appointed by the chair. Everyone will be on one or more committees. Please look for this. Chair will ask you about your interests and where you would like to serve and try to accommodate.

Bill: We have a senate website and bylaws. Senate is defined by the Handbook of Operating Procedures (HOP). You can look there to familiarize yourselves with basic rules, which you should be familiar with.

Terms start Sept 1 and end Aug. 31 two years later. Sometimes you may have to be called on over the. Summer.

Chair's Report:

COVID Planning- attended summer faculty listening sessions. Attended Fall executive planning committee and Fall academic course planning committee.

Senate leadership asked Jewel Washington how many faculty applied for ADA accommodations. 5 ADA were granted, 8 were denied and two were declined because they didn not have a disability. Chair asked Shelby Boseman about the process for ADA accommodations and how they are determined. The information was attached in the email with the agenda.

- Meeting with Dr. Sol, Dr. Aswath and Jewel Washington about ADA. Jewel Washington said that it was back and forth with HR, supervisor and faculty. Sometimes accommodations are other items such as Plexiglas shields or coming to campus a limited amount of times.
- Faculty Senator: What can we do to protect those faculty members who have underlying health conditions (not necessarily disabilities and those who are caregivers to young children who have not been or cannot be vaccinated).
- Jackie: We are aware that this is an issue. What if you have a health condition that isn't on this list? There's no real answer to this question, except you can have plexiglass. Any faculty can request a plexiglass. There's no mechanism for this question so far.
- Kaushik De will chair the new COVID-19 task force to bring together faculty who have expertise in this area.
- We passed a resolution on COVID guidelines in the fall. It can be found on our website. This went to the chancellor and UT-System, regents and media outlets. IT hadn't gained much traction.
- Over summer, we drafted faculty remote work policy, which is in the HOP now. The committee was: Jackie Fay (chair), Toni Sol, Nita Freed, Faculty Affairs, Senate and HR representatives. Takes into account what the faculty work is like.
- Presidential Search: Committee consists of Alan Bowling, Kaushik De, and Jackie Fay (senate has 3 on the committee). Can also nominate people for this.
- A banner was created for senate. Removed "Professor" because it isn't representative of everyone.
- Working on the senate website. Did a history section. Senate was founded in 1973.
- We now have quarterly meetings with Jewel Washington, CHRO We have had two meetings thus far. Three major concerns: 1. Faculty salary compression 2. Ombudsperson 3. Parental leave. Jewel Washington was very supportive of having an Ombudsperson, which will be pursued in the future. Also met with Dr. Samuel about DEI, who will join the meeting later today.
- Venkat: Concern on presidential search committee that we would get a good set of people to apply at this time due to the Delta Variant?

Jackie: Regents are cautious and have a strong desire to get great candidates. Will work with Jewel to get ombudsman.

Academy of Distinguished Service Leaders- Amy Austin, Matt Fujita and David Coursey (chair). The committee needs to put together a procedure in which people can be nominated and apply. Will work on this so that the academy can receive nominations this semester.

TCOFS-Mike Nelson is one representative. We need to elect a second one. There are wo meetings per year.

Parliamentarian-Need to elect a person. If interested let Jackie know by Friday, Sept. 24.

Will vote on these in the next senate meeting.

COACHE: Bill will stay on as chair.

TCOFS-Mike Nelson- no report.

FAC (all UT-System Faculty Senate)-Bill and Jackie attended two since last meeting.

Passed resolution about COVID at different schools and sent to chancellor.

DEI-Sergio Espinos, launched survey at the end of the last semester. Participation from senate was limited.

Tenure and Academic Freedom-Chair is no longer on the senate. Barbara Tobolowsky worked on language in HOP on issue in which faculty who should go up for tenure who are not allowed. New committee will work on this.

Charged with recruiting and retaining faculty and staff. This year will do things to help get that going. Met with Faculty Senate Chairs.

- 2. Increase possibility of exectiving search. Concerns about micro-biases.
- 3. 3. Programs for Heritage Month.
- 4. DEI Certificate Program, 2 workshops through DEI, then 5 to self-select.

After 7, will be presented with certificate for DEI. Demonstrate Mastery.

Will do faculty mentoring-CRTLE

Faculty Senator: Series of Areas that you contact. Did you contact faculty and staff associations?

Samuel: Yes, Dr. Carroll, Dr. Fay and Margie Jackymack.

Faculty Senator: When we have faculty searches how can we get help from your office?

Dr. Samuel: Maintaining subscritpions to a number of various venues. Dept doesn't have to pay to post.

Planning lunch and listening sessions. Will be the first Fridays in Oct., Nov. and Dec.

COVID Testing-Kaushik De (Special Report)

Pushing for sharing of data for almost a month. Requiring contact tracing. Resolution said UTA policies should be data driven. Difficult to draw meaningful conclusions. Testing positivity rate-3 blocks of data. Positivity rate went up by a factor of 3 over a few weeks.
