Service Learning Project to Support UT System Tobacco Free Campus




- This story began.....





UTA Eliminate Tobacco Service Learning Project: HOW to MIRROR this experience for AO students?

The first step: National Public Health Week Eliminate Tobacco Virtual Watch Party






Spring 2020 Project Overview

- Collaborative project with KINE 4357 on-campus and accelerated online students
- Within each class, students formed teams of 4-5 students
- Matched tobacco-related topics so that OC and AO student teams researched similar topics





Spring 2020 Project Overview, con't.

- OC students conducted live presentations for UTA faculty staff and Lunch-n-Learn on March 4, 2020
- AO students created screen-recorded Ignite presentations for Virtual Watch Party on April 10, 2020
 - Ignite presentation format:
 - Length: five minutes
 - Created in MS Power Point, sides advance every 15 seconds
 - Similar to TEDx
