## Self-Reported Academic Record Requirement for First-Year Students

**Incoming first-year students who want to be considered for general merit scholarships must submit a Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR) to UTA after submitting their admissions application.** The SRAR allows students to self-report their courses, grades, class rank, and other academic information directly to UTA thereby speeding up the application process. Once the student registers for classes at UTA, we will validate the student's high school record after receiving the final official high school transcript. The SRAR can be found in the student's UTA portal in their To Do list later, if needed. When they click on the high school transcript link, it will give them the option of submitting the SRAR or students can complete their SRAR at any time by visiting <https://srar.selfreportedtranscript.com/Login.asp>.

## Expanded Guaranteed Admissions Pathways and Personal Statement for First-Year Students

Students applying to UTA for fall 2025 will see a new component on their UTA college application. Students will need to submit a brief personal statement as part of their application packet. The personal statement is limited to 500 characters and asks students to share any challenges or extenuating circumstances they experienced during high school that may have impacted their academic performance and what they did to overcome those challenges. While the personal statement is not required to submit an application, it is strongly recommended that students submit it along with their application. The personal statement will be reviewed and taken into consideration when a student does not meet guaranteed admission criteria to UTA as part of the individual holistic review process. If a student does not submit a personal statement with their application, they will experience a delay in their application review.

UTA has also added several pathways for admission to the university. Multiple combinations of unweighted GPAs, class rank (if provided), and test scores (if submitted), will now offer additional ways to receive guaranteed admission to UTA. The new pathways also consider advanced credit to recognize the students' effort in taking a more rigorous high school curriculum through AP, IB, dual credit, and honors courses.
