Admission Requirements

Freshman Admissions

For automatic admission, prospective freshmen should graduate from high school with one of the following diploma types: (HB5) Distinguished Achievement or endorsements or (UAS) Recommended or Distinguished.

Students must also meet the SAT/ACT requirements by class rank quartile Freshman Admission Standards chart. Students who graduate on the Minimum Diploma or the Foundations diploma with no endorsements must meet state benchmarks.

- * UTA welcomes applicants from non-ranking public or private school. You must meet the requirements outlined above and will be considered for admission based on individual review.
- ** The SAT score is calculated by combining the highest Evidence-Based Reading, Writing and Math scores. The ACT score is the composite score, which includes the English, Reading, Math and Science sections. UTA does not require an essay.

Transfer Admissions
