## RCE Mission and Vision





2002: UN General Assembly adopts resolution for *Decade of Education for Sustainable Development* (UNDESD 2005-2014)

2003: United Nations University Institute for the Advanced Study of Sustainability (UNU-IAS) launches global network of Regional Centres of Expertise on ESD (RCEs)

UNESCO <u>ESD for 2030 Roadmap</u> five priority action areas: advancing policy, transforming learning environments, building capacities of educators, empowering and mobilizing youth, and accelerating local level actions

-RCEs play a crucial role, esp. re. 5<sup>th</sup> goal

As of January 2022: 180 RCEs acknowledge by UNU, 27 in Americas


































## SDG 4.7: Education for Sustainable Development (ESD)

4.7 - By 2030, ensure all learners acquire knowledge and skills needed to promote sustainable development, including among others through education for sustainable development and sustainable lifestyles, human rights, gender equality, promotion of a culture of peace and non-violence, global citizenship, and appreciation of cultural diversity and of culture's contribution to sustainable development.


# Regional Centers of Expertise for Education on Sustainable Development (ESD)

ESD Program established at UNU-IAS for UN Decade of ESD (2005-2014)

RCEs are networks of individuals and formal, non-formal, and informal organizations and institutions that facilitate ESD in local and regional communities, through education, training, and public awareness to build a sustainable future.


Focus on regional challenges, needs, and resources.

RCEs develop proposal: define region & regional SD issues, RCE vision, governance model, partners/collaborators (including at least 1 university), resources/finances

- . January: UNU open call for applications
- May: submission of first draft
- June: comments from Global RCE Service Centre and Peer Reviewers
- September: Final application and summary
- December: Review by Ubuntu Committee of Peers for the RCEs
- January: Announcement of UNU RCE Acknowledgement







A sustainable Shenandoah Valley preserves and enhances our unique educational, social, environmental, and economic resources to ensure the future well-being of Valley residents

#### RCE Application approved in 2013

- A collaboration of regional institutions of higher education including four 4-year colleges and one community college
- After receiving RCE approval, several years were spent developing a working structure, strategic plan, and by-laws, and obtaining MOU approval from partner institutions
- Primary foci for Sustainable Shenandoah Valley:
  - Convene diverse sustainability-related entities throughout central Shenandoah Valley
  - Mobilize regional higher ed resources and empower youth
  - Amplify existing initiatives
  - Facilitate and promote connections to SDGs

Universities and colleges around the world are making commitments to advance the UN SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals) through their teaching, research, operations, and partnerships. One proven model for making good on this commitment is to establish a United Nations-affiliated RCE network. RCEs – Regional Centers of Expertise on Education for Sustainable Development – are regional multi-stakeholder networks, grounded in higher education, that advance the SDGs through education and training. RCEs are proliferating, with over 180 networks around the world, including 27 in the Americas.

In this cohort-based course, leaders from RCE networks from the U.S. and Canada will share experiences, case studies, and lessons learned on how universities and colleges can help lead multi-stakeholder collaborations that localize and advance the SDGs in their regions.



- January 2024: UNU open call for applications
- May 2024: submission of first draft
- June 2024: comments from Global RCE Service Centre and Peer Reviewers
- September 2024: Final application and summary
- December 2024: Review by Ubuntu Committee of Peers for the RCEs
- January 2025: Announcement of UNU RCE Acknowledgement
