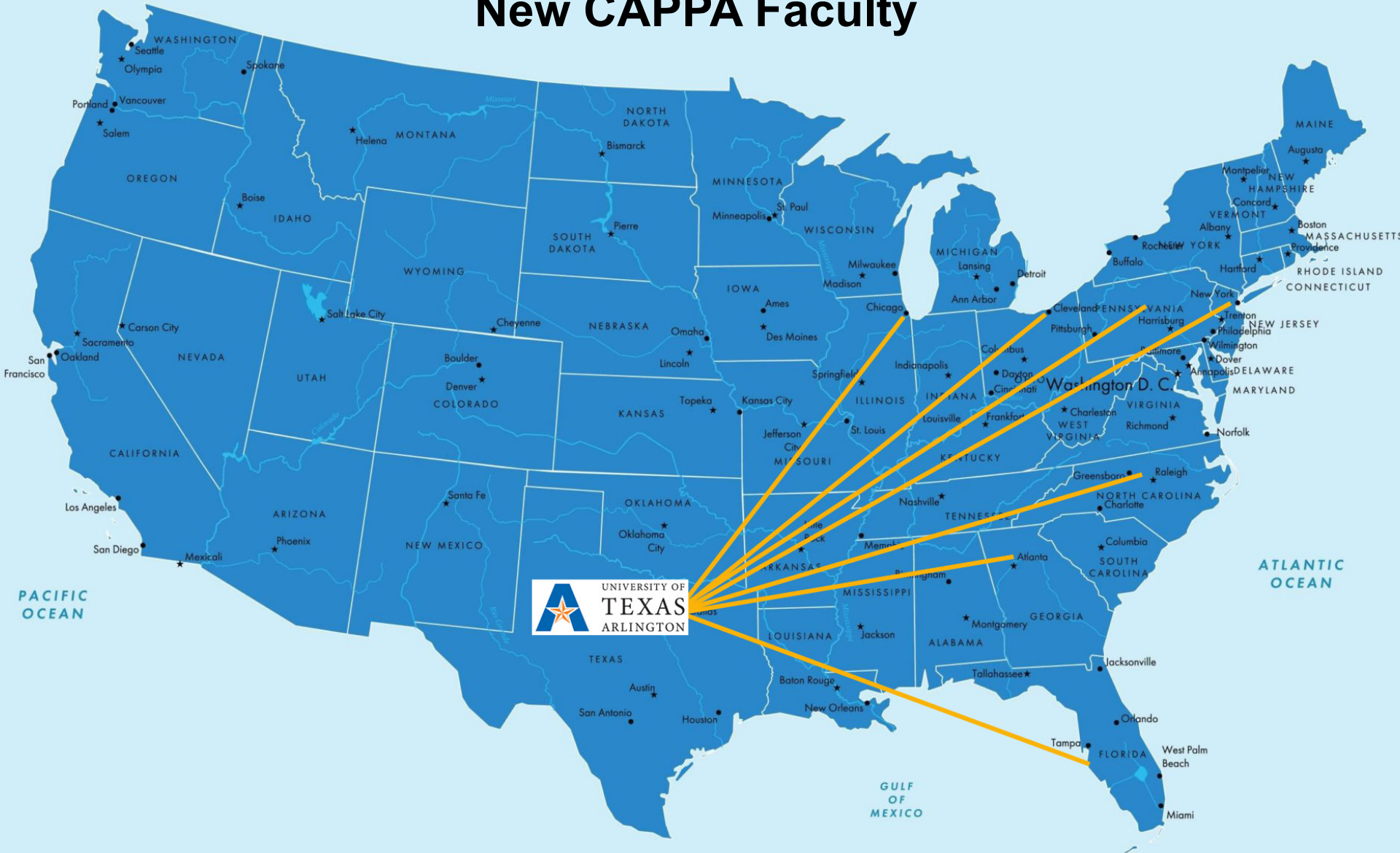

Class Modalities



"Online 1"

All instruction and testing online. All classes are asynchronous with no required synchronous components.

"Online 2"

All instruction and testing occur online asynchronously but some synchronous online class attendance or participation required (dates specified in the syllabus for synchronous components).

"Traditional Face-to-Face"

Fully face-to-face (F2F).
Online only after Thanksgiving.

Class Modalities



Hybrid 1

"Hybrid 1"

All instructions online. Testing/student presentations on specified dates and times will be F2F only up to Thanksgiving (specified on syllabus after confirming with facilities). Alternatives needed for students unable to attend in-person. Proctoring services may be required. Friday/Sat testing possible.



Hybrid 2

"Hybrid 2"

A combination of online and F2F activities occur in the course. All students enrolled in the course meet one day per week F2F and other instructional times (1-2 days per week) occur online, synchronously or asynchronously.



Hybrid 3

"Hybrid 3"

A combination of online and F2F activities and instruction occur in the course. Seat time is rotated among students. For example, a class with an enrollment of 90, 45 students attend one day, the other 45 attend the other day.



Hybrid 4

"Hybrid 4"

Laboratory, studio, performance art classes. Customized scheduling based on requirements.

Building Safety

- Modified layouts for physical distancing
- Directional signage for one-way foot traffic in major corridors
 - Granite stairs are for upward travel in the building. North and south fire stairs will be used for downward travel and exiting the building.

- Water Fountain Closures



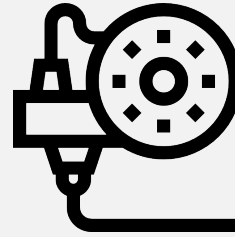
Computer Lab + Tech Needs

- Computer Lab 1st Floor: By Appointment
 - *Monday - Friday: 8am – 5pm*
- Computer Labs 3rd Floor: No appointment necessary
 - *Monday - Friday: 8am – 6pm*
 - *Weekends: 9am – 5pm*
 - *Student printing only in 3rd floor lab*
- Central Library: Limited amount of Laptops, Hotspots, and Webcams available for student check-out. First-come first-serve
- Starting a program for a limited number of students to remotely access software via the internet using their personal computer. *This pilot program will be run for a studio with possible rollout to a larger number of students in future semesters.*

- Wood Fabrication Lab available by appointment only



Studios

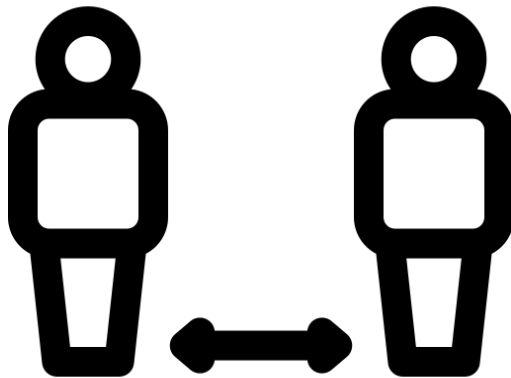
- Students will be assigned a studio desk on campus
- Desks are not to be moved in studios or classrooms
- Access hours for studio will be 8am – 10pm
- Physical distancing and masks are always mandatory
- Students who do not wear a mask in class/studio will be asked to leave
- Studio desks will not be checked out for home use

Fall 2020 Commencement

- A VERY tentative date of November 19 - 22 has been held
- UTA will confirm or update this by October 1, 2020.
- Fall commencement will be for 2020 Spring, Summer, and Fall Graduates



Limit Exposure Before Spring Classes



- Students are asked to limit social activities and exposure to outsiders for 14 days prior to returning to campus
- Combined with daily self-monitoring, wearing masks, and social distancing, laying low prior to returning to campus will help minimize the spread of the COVID-19 virus and ensure the Maverick community stays healthy
