### Student Achievement

Percentage of the 2021-2022 MCRP graduate students' theses or final professional projects rated Pass (75% - 85%) or High Pass (85% or better) in overall performance based on a 12-item rubric: All, **100%** students achieved a High Pass or Pass (with a breakdown of: **40%** (High-Pass) and **60%** (Pass)).

This result was based on the Overall Assessment Rubric used to rate the thesis or project and its oral defense by a three-person Thesis/Professional Report Supervisory Committee. The 12-item rubric measures the ability to formulate a planning investigation question, design a plan of action, generate evidence, assess results, propose a solution, and publicly articulate their findings
