



Minor In PHOTOGRAPHY

The minor in photography prepares an art or non-art major to develop proficiency in photographic image making and printing. Our program is fine art based and the tools that are learned are applicable to a range of practices. After completing four required courses, students can choose from a range of upper level classes depending on individual goals.

The student's major department must approve any minor. However, students interested in Photography as a minor should consult an Art and Art History Department advisor/faculty advisor to determine the most advantageous selection of courses. A Photography Minor requires at least 18 credit hours in a given program, including credit hours of advanced work.
