



UTA Art + Art History Internship Program

The Art + Art History Department at UTA offers programs of concentration in Art Certification, Art History, Clay, Drawing, Film/Video/Screenwriting, Glass, Painting, Photography, Printmaking, Sculpture, and Visual Communication.

We currently have active internship partnerships with various Metroplex museums, print shops, design firms, photographers, art therapists, and film studios. The goal of each partnership is to provide relevant professional experience and mentorship for our students, while they contribute to the professional growth and creative development of professional businesses and non-profits. Many organizations request interns from our program year after year.

Our students have advanced internships into permanent employment opportunities with the Texas Rangers, The Jim Henson Company, KERA, the Goss-Michael Foundation, Concussion LLP, The LTV Group, and Fusion Graphic & Interior Design (in Jordan).

Our faculty hand select students for each internship opportunity, ensuring that potential interns have the appropriate skillset and demeanor to fulfill the requirements of a position. Only advanced level students qualify for internships – they must have completed at least 4 advanced courses, and must have a 3.0 or better GPA in the department.

When considering whether to participate in the Art + Art History Department's internship program, employers should assess how they can offer professional training and growth for an intern, and whether a qualified student will be an appropriate fit for their organization's needs. Please be aware, students cannot miss class for internship duties.

Department staff and faculty are available to discuss the program and review job descriptions as appropriate. (Detailed qualifications and project outlines ensure that we send the most appropriately qualified candidates to your organization. Please use the attached document as a template.) Students are instructed to contact their potential employers directly to arrange interviews and site visits.
