3.0 ART GPA REQUIRED FOR BFA

NOTE: Students have the option to enroll in Summer classes to relieve course load during regular terms.

Student Concentration Portfolio Reviews (CPR): 21hr and 36hr

21hr CPR will be able to recommend either acceptance into the B.F.A. program (a pre-professional program) or into the B.A. degree.

Transfer and new students would be allowed to register for the BFA/BA degree as "Art intended."

Courses within Art Foundations, Art Elective studios, and Concentration courses may be considered for 21hr CPR. As 21 and 36 studio class hours are achieved, each potential B.F.A. student will be reviewed by appropriate faculty (not by a standing committee). At 21 hrs, the review would have the purpose of "entrance" into the BFA/BA programs. 36hr CPR ensures students' advanced level work is satisfactory with program requirements and expectations. The College of Education Requirements

- (1) All students must be admitted to Teacher Certification Program before enrolling in education courses.
- (2) Application to School of Education should occur once you reach 60-70 credit hours.
- (3) As of Fall 2017, the College of Education will require a minimum GPA, not less than 2.75, for any applicant that leads to a cohort average of 3.0 or higher. A student's cumulative or last 60 credit hours GPA must meet or exceed 2.75 that leads to a cohort average of 3.0 or higher. This is a cumulative GPA that includes grades earned at both UTA and other institutions of higher education.
- (4) As of January 1, 2017, the College of Education will use the TSI status for program admission. A status of "TSI complete" replaces the previous THEA require ment. Eligible students ready to begin coursework within the College of Education will need to contact an education advisor to review eligibility and the application process. A TEAL account must be created at that time.
