### Undergraduate Certificate in Medical Humanities

An undergraduate certificate in medical humanities aims to integrate humanities scholarship and training in health-related fields. Medical Humanities brings the methods and concerns of humanities disciplines to bear on the study of health and health care. The interdisciplinary certificate approaches medical issues—such as illness, treatment, disability, death, and health policy—from historical, philosophical, literary, and cultural perspectives.

The undergraduate certificate in medical humanities will include 12 credit hours from the list of courses below or other relevant special topics courses with the approval of the advisor. There is one required course: HUMA 3300 (Medical Humanities). *Students can count toward the certificate no more than **two** courses from a single department, though more than two courses in a department may count toward a major or minor. **At least three courses must be from the College of Liberal Arts.***
