DIRECTOR'S NOTES

An electrifying electropop opera inspired by a scandalous slice of Leo Tolstoy's War and Peace? Why not!?

Natasha, Pierre & The Great Comet of 1812 opened at Ars Nova in October of 2012 and moved Off-Broadway a year later. This inventive show, directed by Rachel Chavkin, was staged as an immersive production, with action happening around and among the audience, complete with roving musicians. The set designed by Mimi Lien and lights by Bradley King transformed the Ars Nova space into a Russian supper club. It challenged the audience's preconceived ideas of musical theatre performance spaces.

I first encountered the work of Dave Malloy, a composer/lyricist/orchestrator/book writer/ sometime performer, when the show transferred to Broadway starring Josh Groban as the title character. Malloy, along with his brilliant collaborators and cast, broke down the binary of the more traditional Broadway proscenium experience with *Natasha*, *Pierre & The Great Comet of 1812* in a most impactful production. The songs of *Great Comet* are adventurous and dangerous, at turns hilarious and heartbreaking, and never bound by old-fashioned rules or historical period logic. Each song rattles within us as a collective; so much so that we didn't just rehearse the musical but felt it viscerally as we experienced this electropop opera together.

Great Comet's immersive setting has inspired me to continue to seek out work and methods of storytelling that remove the barriers between performance and audience for a more essential and challenging theatrical experience. As a result, our rehearsal and performance space has been both exciting and challenging. The musical has challenged us to balance the past and present in unexpected ways and we have discovered that we have much to learn from what our predecessors experienced.

So many of us, who consider making musical theater on stage the "what we do", have had to begin to reimagine our purpose and processes to build strength for our community so that together we can continue to make this art in the face of growing adversity. We are thrilled that you are here supporting these young artists and our UTA theatrical community as we explore and reimagine this exciting storytelling adventure.

ANNE HEALY - Director

Anne Healy is an Associate Professor at UTA where she teaches Directing and Musical Theatre and is currently the Associate Chair for Academics. Anne earned her bachelors and master's degrees in Musical Theatre and a Ph.D. in Aesthetic Studies focusing on Theatre and Musical Theatre. An Equity actor, she has appeared Off-Broadway and at major regional theatres. An associate member of SDC, directing includes the Tony Award winning Dallas Theatre Center as Assistant Director *Raisin in the Sun* and as a Directing Observer for *My Paris* with Kathleen Marshall at Goodspeed Musicals in CT. Director at UTA: *The Theory of Relativity* (Regional Premiere), *Troupers: A Musical Vaudeville* (World Premiere), *West Side Story, The Music Man, Ragtime, See What I Wanna See, Sweeney Todd,* and *Bright Star.* Anne's co-written chapter on the musical theatre director was published in The Routledge Companion to Musical Theatre in 2022 and has another book chapter appearing in the "Rodgers and Hammerstein in Context" series for Cambridge University Press.
