# **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

As a kid, I had a wild imagination. Ask my often-exasperated parents. Skits were peformed regularly in the living room. At the center of my stories, I was always the brave hero and often, Pirates attacking a foreign shore (aka "the couch"), were my chosen foes to conquer. Eventually I grew out of this phase, as we all do, and began to understand the complexities of the real-life dramas that tug at our weary adult day to day lives. But thankfully, that little boy whose boundless imagination could dream up such wild things still resides deep within me. And Lavery's script beckoned to him.

I was instantly drawn to the deep longing for adventure that Jim craves in this marvelously creative and humorous adaptation of Stevenson's classic novel. Jim's life is full of possibility and where danger is present, she runs straight towards it, like a moth to flame. As the unlikely heroine, Jim's complete lack of inhibition within her childhood instincts brings vitality and energy to this story. Lavery's most thoughtful approach to pen such a strong female identity among the fictitious literary annals of male-dominated tropes meets the moment. We are reminded that childhood imagination is limitless. Equally important, we realize that the parameters of adventure are not bound by gender expectations.

As you prepare to watch the show, I ask that you also find that little rambunctious "you" that heroically fought monsters and valiantly defeated villains. Dig deep. Find that "you" who spent much time daily in imagination, before the reality of aging stifled the instinct. That "you" is still there. Bring them to the experience, they'll enjoy getting out again.

Thank you to Dr. Higgins, the faculty designers, theatre department staff and the wonderful student cast and crew for "choosing me to tell you, from beginning to end, keeping nothing back but its bearings all the particulars about *Treasure Island*." I am honored to do so.
