Admission Requirements and Procedures

■ ADMISSION PROCEDURES

To be considered for admission, a student must:

- Have an active unencumbered RN license (United States)
- Earned an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) or Nursing Diploma with a minimum of 29 Semester Credit Hours (SCH) of nursing coursework
- Meet UTA's undergraduate admissions requirements

Applicants deficient in nursing credit hours may earn Experiential Learning in Nursing credit to meet the minimum 29 SCH requirement.

■ NURSING APPLICATION DEADLINES

- Fall Semester entry: **May 15**

■ TOEFL REQUIREMENT

Official TOEFL scores are required from International students from non-native English speaking countries on the following visas: B, C, D, F, H-4, dependents of H1C, H2-2A, and H-2B visa holders, J, M, O-2, O-3, P, Q, S, TN, TD, TWOV. Nursing Elective (Upper-Division)

Three hours of a junior- or senior-level nursing elective is required for graduation.

Total of Nursing Hours: 35 credit hours

Electives: A student must complete two upper-division (junior- or senior-level courses) prior to graduation. One elective must be a nursing course. The second elective requirement can be met by taking any upper-division elective course (including a second nursing elective), by providing documentation of being certified through a nationally recognized nursing certification examination, or by completing a work-based project in the Nursing Cooperative Education (Co-op) Program.
