## **Admission Requirements and Procedures**

#### ADMISSION PROCEDURES

To be considered for admission, a student must:

- · Have an active unencumbered RN license (United States)
- Earned an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) or Nursing Diploma with a minimum of 29 Semester Credit Hours (SCH) of nursing coursework
- · Meet UTA's undergraduate admissions requirements

Applicants deficient in nursing credit hours may earn Experiential Learning in Nursing credit to meet the minimum 29 SCH requirement.

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### **Nursing Elective (Upper-Division)**

Three hours of a junior- or senior-level nursing elective is required for graduation.

## Total of Nursing Hours: 35 credit hours

Electives: A student must complete two upper-division (junior- or senior-level courses) prior to graduation. One elective must be a nursing course. The second elective requirement can be met by taking any upper-division elective course (including a second nursing elective), by providing documentation of being certified through a nationally recognized nursing certification examination, or by completing a work-based project in the Nursing Cooperative Education (Co-op) Program.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup> Courses must be completed with a grade of C or above.
