

## Bachelor of Science in Nursing Estimated Upper-Division Nursing Program Expenses

- Because the upper-division nursing program consists of both coursework and clinical experiences, there are additional costs involved. These additional costs are indicated on the first and second charts below.
- Prices listed are estimates and based on previous expenses, all pricing and requirements are subject to change. Prices listed are rounded to the nearest \$5.00.
- For a student pursuing a second baccalaureate degree, funding is limited. Grants are not available and there is a limit on student loan funding. For additional information, contact the <u>UT Arlington</u> <u>Financial Aid Office</u>.
- If English is your second language, a computer software program is available to assist with language skills specific to the healthcare field in the UT Arlington College of Nursing and Health Innovation (CONHI) Student Success Center. If residing outside the Dallas-Fort Worth area, the software program is available for checkout.
- Maximum Outside Employment Hours while in the upper-division nursing program: Due to the rigorous nature of the upper-division nursing program and the time commitments of the coursework and clinical, it is preferred that students do not work while in the program. If working while in the upper-division nursing program, it is recommended that students work a maximum of 15-20 hours per week. Some students may find that is too much, depending on other commitments and personal study habits.
- UT Arlington offers the <u>Money Management Center</u> as a resource for assistance with budgeting, savings and credit awareness. Appointments are available in person, over the phone, or via Skype.
- CONHI Scholarships are available after completing the JR I semester. Apply through <u>Scholarshop</u>.
