Approval of Minutes. The minutes of the regular meeting on April 24, 2007, were approved with corrections as discussed. (Minutes posted on the web were corrected.)

Report of the Registration, Calendar and Scheduling Committee. Robert Gunnip presented the following report and proposal for the 2008-2009 and Fall 2009 academic calendars for approval. The calendars were approved.

The following Fall 2008 through Fall 2009 Academic Calendar proposal by the Registration, Calendar and Scheduling Committee is presented for your consideration. The Fall 2009 Academic Calendar proposal is being included this year as an addendum to the 2008-2009 Academic Calendar proposal to facilitate the long-range planning needs of some programs and offices into the Fall 2009 term.

This calendar proposal calls for our Summer and Fall registration periods to open on the first Monday in April (starting in April 2008) and for our Spring registration period to open on the first Monday in October (starting in October 2008). We are proposing these earlier registration start dates to align our registration periods with those at other Texas public universities and colleges. By moving our Fall registration start date back from the first Monday in June to the first Monday in April, we will be able to register the majority of our continuing students in their Fall classes before they return home for summer break. At the same time, we will also be able to identify continuing students who haven't registered by the end of April and contact them to register for their Fall classes before they leave for summer break the second week in May.

This calendar proposal also includes a "tentative" Spring Break 2009 proposal. The committee is asking you to approve March 16-20, 2009 as the "tentative" Spring Break week for UTA in 2009, and that you permit the Office of Admissions, Records and Registration to change this "tentative" break week to the "approved" Spring Break 2009 week if Arlington ISD selects March 16-20, 2009 as its Spring Break week in 2009 when the AISD Board of Trustees convenes next month to adopt the AISD 2008-2009 school year calendar. Please note: should AISD choose a Spring Break 2009 week other than March 16-20, 2009, the committee will meet and bring to the assembly a final Spring Break 2009 proposal.

The remaining entries on this calendar proposal follow the guidelines used in prior years for the number of instruction days and final exam days for each session.

Report of the Undergraduate Curriculum Committee. Kimberly van Noort gave a demonstration of the new online curriculum change process.

The entire curriculum approval system is now online. Everybody at the university can see every change that has at least received departmental approval. It is easy to access from your research profile or you can do it through the undergraduate curriculum website. The undergraduate curriculum webiste gives you some information on how we do curriculum approvals. There's a list of all the committee members from the various colleges and schools. There are guides on how to use the system. There are dates for subcommittee meetings. There is a direct link that will take to the curriculum system login page or the profile system login page.

When you login, it will bring to your home faculty profile page. There is a new tab now, a curriculum tab. When you click on the curriculum tab, you can see all these changes that have been approved. Departments may go in and initiate a course catalog change request. Also through this system, you can make a change to the course inventory which means you can add, change or delete a class. Not everybody can go in and initiate it. You must request access.

When something is approved, it is automatically routed. It goes first to the department chair. The department chair receives an email notifying him that there is something that needs to be approved. Then it routes on to the next level, the college or school committee, and then it routes to the university level. After the Undergraduate Assembly approves it, Michael Moore goes in and approves it. It is all automatic.

As soon as we are done with one semester, they will archive and it will automatically be transferred into the course catalog. We are hoping this will minimize errors in the catalog because there will be no reentry of information. The course inventory likewise will feed back into the My Mav system so that information will get there as accurately as possible.

Other Business. Ron Elsenbaumer mentioned that at a future meeting, the Assembly will be discussing lowering degree programs to 120 hours. Many of you have already been working in your programs to meet the Coordinating Board's request of getting of our degree programs down to 120 hours.

Also our Academic Standards Committee will have a report. Michael Moore explained that the Academic Standards Committee was asked to consider a couple of items. The first is exceptions to the grade exclusion policy. The second thing is the alignment between departmental and college/school grade point continuance requirements and how they compare with the university's grade point requirements.

Dr. Elsenbaumer also pointed out that in the spring, there will be reports on core curriculum evaluations mandated by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. Dr. Moore added that last year, the Assembly received reports from Math, Sciences, Communication and English Departments. This year we're adding more units as part of that next sequence. Social Science and Visual Arts reports will be due in the spring. The Curriculum Committee will also be examining the lists of courses that satisfy the fine arts requirement and the social science requirement. Those lists have existed quite a long time and have not been revisited. We've added courses to the curriculum and courses have dropped off so we are going to reexamine the lists.
