CANVAS UPDATES

- The main Canvas configuration is complete and is functioning well as used by Spring Pilot faculty. Unicheck, the digital plagiarism tool has been successfully integrated into Canvas and is available for faculty to use. Instructions for using Unicheck are available for students and instructors on the Canvas Training page. In addition, Ally, a digital accessibility tool, has been integrated into Canvas and is pending deployment. A campus-wide working group is being identified to assist with Ally's rollout to the campus community.
- ➤ The Spring Canvas Pilot has been successful to date. Faculty and students are particularly pleased with the <u>Canvas app</u>.
- The Canvas Project Team continues to work with each college/school on the Campus Course Migration. Faculty identified to migrate Summer courses (Group 1) were invited to attend Migration Orientation sessions in-person or via Echo360. The Echo360 recordings have been made available to Champions and Group 1 faculty who were unable to attend. The Migration Orientation focused on the migration process, training material regarding pre-migration steps, and migration target dates. Note that Group 1 includes 400 courses that will be migrated by Canvas White Glove staff after faculty have cleaned up their courses by using the migration guidelines and the pre-migration checklist. - Summer courses. Champions are also collaborating with the Canvas Project Team to identify courses to be included in future migration groups based on the <u>canvas migration plan</u>.

 Non-academic users are actively working with the Canvas Team to develop course

content, including Compliance Training, Librarians and soon the campus advisors.

Colleges are encouraged to add to their Canvas Training course their academic administrative staff, GTAs and others that support faculty with LMS questions.

White Glove is a professional service offered by Canvas to assist faculty with

- course migration from Blackboard to Canvas. A designated professional Canvas White Glove team will perform the course migration and will work with each course instructor to make sure the conversion is properly done.

 As migration begins with White Glove, faculty are contacted directly by the Canvas White Glove Team to review the course to be migrated. In addition, once migration is
- complete, the faculty member will be required to validate the migrated course(s) in Canvas within 5 days of the completion of the migration.

 To use this service, Faculty are required to clean up their course to reduce its size to 3GB or less based on the premigration checklist provided by the Canvas Team. A

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- CANVAS FEATURE OF THE MONTH

Arc is a communication tool that allows instructors and students to engage with media content by commenting directly on the media timeline. Students can learn from each other's insights as well as from the instructor's direction and feedback. It can also assists in close-

captioning videos with ~ 80% accuracy. College Champions have shared that it is a nice resource and they are impressed with the ease of usability.

The Canvas Teacher mobile app allows faculty to engage with their students on the go, both inside and outside the classroom. This app provides quick access to grading, communicating, and updating—three of the most frequent course facilitation tasks for faculty through Announcements, Assignments, Discussions, and Quizzes. one of the favorite ones reported by College Champions and Pilot Instructors.
