Canvas Commons is a shared learning repository created and maintained by Canvas users. Commons allows instructors to store and retrieve course resources (i.e. modules, assignments, videos, etc.) and share these resources with colleagues, and the broader

Canvas community. Faculty can also search for UTA templates in the Commons. The Canvas Commons offers faculty ideas for updating an existing course and/or reviewing materials or learning resources from other courses shared by instructors which can be
