Canvas Upload

Beginning **Fall 2019**, Canvas will be the system of record for course syllabi. Upload your syllabus to your course in Canvas and it will automatically upload to Digital Measures and your Mentis profile.

The Canvas upload is a one-stop shop and eliminates the need to upload in multiple places. In your Canvas course, on the left-hand side in the white gallery, you will find an "upload syllabus" label (second from the bottom).

Click on that label and it will take you to a page where you will find a "**upload/update syllabus**" button. We encourage you to use the university template because it is already formatted for accessibility.

If you create your own, you need to verify it for accessibility. Upload the syllabus and it will create a link that will appear in the appropriate course under "Scheduled Teaching" in Digital Measures as well as in your public facing Mentis profile.

Any new version of the same course syllabus that you upload will override the previous version. All previous versions of the syllabus will be available to you under "syllabus_upload" folder in case you need to reference a previous version.

All Grades in Canvas for Fall

As we advance our student success efforts across campus, grade data is integral to this effort. After obtaining feedback from the deans and other campus stakeholders, the provost approved an effort to have <u>all grades</u> entered in Canvas (<u>4 week</u>, 8 week and <u>final grades</u>).

Although 4 week grades are required for <u>specific student</u> <u>groups</u> such as athletes, faculty for all undergraduate courses are encouraged to use a syllabus quiz or <u>similar assignment</u> to provide an early indication of student engagement, which allows for faster intervention by the <u>Division of Student</u> <u>Success</u>. CDE's <u>training</u> page offers sessions on using the Canvas gradebook, and also offers <u>Canvas Open Lab Hours</u>.

Canvas Migration Ends

Approximately 1,200 courses were migrated through the Canvas White Glove process. The Canvas team is ready to support faculty migrating their own content through ongoing training.

Faculty are also reminded that Canvas's video platform, ARC has been renamed Studio. ARC no longer appears on Canvas course menus and instead faculty will see Studio as a menu tab. Please remind students that are assigned larger video projects (more than 15 min in length) to download the app

Syllabi Template and Faculty Profiles

To ensure that UTA is in compliance with accessibility requirements and <u>SB 2504</u>, faculty must use the syllabus template in <u>Canvas</u>. Faculty can download the template from their Canvas course, insert the appropriate information and upload to Canvas. The syllabus will migrate to the appropriate course in their Digital Measures (DM) profile and then to faculty's public facing Mentis profile.

Echo360 Training - August 15th The Echo360 Active Learning Platform is a service that

integrates personal and classroom video capture, student engagement tools, and analytic tools to maximize student participation and engagement for both campus-based and online courses. The University of Texas at Arlington has been utilizing the Echo360 platform since January 2009. The system can be divided into two parts... lecture capture & video management and interactive classroom tools. UTA has a site license with Echo360, so there is no charge to use it for instructors or students.

UTA's Echo360 administrator, Don Lane, will be holding training

on August 15th in University Hall 115. He will cover lecture capture from 1pm to 2pm, interactive tools from 2pm to 3pm, and have an open Q&A from 3pm to 4pm. You do not need to sign up... just come and learn about this powerful tool.
