Open Education Grant Program RFP

UTA Libraries are now accepting proposals for the UTA CARES Grant Program. The program supports use and creation of open educational resources (OER), which are free teaching and learning materials that are licensed to allow for revision and reuse.

OER adoption stipends of \$1,000 each will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis beginning immediately. Additional grant funding of up to \$10,000 per project is available to support innovative open education projects. Grant applications are due by March 31.

The Libraries also provide free access to a web-based publishing platform to support the development and dissemination of UTA-authored textbooks, as well as other educational resources. The tool allows for embedded video, images, and audio files; supports integration of interactive quizzes and demonstrations; and enables public or private web annotations.
