Student Feedback Surveys (SFS)

Faculty can access [SFS data](#) for their courses AFTER final grades are posted and certified by the Registrar's Office (may take 3-5 days depending on number of late grades). SFS data is in two systems:

- To access evaluations from **Spring 2019 to the present term**, please access SmartEvals by clicking the link at the top of this page <http://www.uta.edu/ier/Surveys/SFS/>. A [quick tutorial](#) is also available.
- To access your evaluations from **Fall 2018 to Fall 2019**, please visit uta.edu/SFS and click on uta.mce.cc at the top of the page to access IOTA. Log in using your Single Sign-On. A [video tutorial](#) is available to walk faculty through this process
- To access missing SFS data or evaluations prior to Fall 2018, please go to www.uta.edu/SFS. Click on "Faculty" on the left hand menu and scroll all the way to the bottom of the page for a link requesting missing SFS data.

Please note that a minimum of 5 students must be enrolled in a course to launch the SFS. For questions, please contact facultyaffairs@uta.edu.

Accessibility in Course Content

To support UTA's commitment to providing an inclusive and accessible learning environment for all students, [Ally](#) is now in all Canvas courses as of January 6, 2020. It allows users to access course content in a variety of formats including audio, HTML, PDFs and ensuring that course content can be read by electronic readers.

Title IX Changes

All employees including UTA faculty, graduate teaching assistants and staff are mandatory reporters ("Responsible Employees") and must report all known incidents of sexual misconduct. As of January 1, 2020, Texas laws [SB 212](#) and [HB 1735](#) add severe sanctions for employees who fail to report or knowingly file a false report, including termination and potential criminal charges.
