Canvas Migration Update

We have migrated approximately 1,030 courses from Blackboard to Canvas to save our faculty time and effort! We still have one more group to migrate before the end of summer. Thank you to all the faculty that have completed their training, our pilot group in Spring that ran ~35 courses in Canvas to help test our systems, and the summer faculty that are running their courses in Canvas. The feedback has been very positive and the Canvas Team is grateful for your patience during this transition.

Faculty are reminded that **Blackboard will not be available for Fall 2019 courses**. If you have not completed your Canvas training, there are many opportunities for <u>training</u> online, at your own pace, or in face-to-face courses.

Face-to-Face, Online and Hybrid Courses

Faculty are reminded that students must have full knowledge of the delivery method for their course at registration. Courses must stay consistent with the delivery method listed in the schedule of classes (MyMav) and **not be changed after the start of classes**, unless permission is obtained from the Chair and Dean. For example, a face-to-face course cannot become a hybrid course or online after the start of classes, unless extenuating circumstances are present, and permission is granted from the college leadership. ....UTA's response rate for the <u>Student Feedback Surveys</u> in Spring 2019 was 48.5%, almost 10 points higher than last year's Spring rates. Students receive a daily email reminder and faculty also receive informational reminders to increase response rates, including using the <u>SmartEvals</u> QR code, and providing time in class.
