Preparing to Teach Online: Communicate with Your Students

A <u>survey</u> of UTA students has received 4,329 responses, and students indicate that they are uncertain about what to expect as they await the start of classes next week. Please communicate with your students this week to provide them a brief update on your preparations and what they can expect.

Some suggestions to consider in your messaging to students:

- Your preparations for the rest of semester: "my course will be in Canvas, so students can start learning how to use this platform by reviewing the <u>Canvas Student</u> <u>Orientation</u>."
- Canvas is now integrated with Teams. You might share that you are creating a Teams site to help with communication. Learn how to <u>Install Teams</u>, and <u>How to</u> <u>Join a Teams meeting</u>.
- Ask students to prepare a space at home to study and review these suggestions for <u>staying focused</u>.
- Review the technical requirements for software that is used in your course (e,.g The Pearson LockDown Browser currently does not work on tablets; the Respondus Lockdown browsers will work on tablets and desktops but not phones).

You might share that you are reviewing the syllabus and will be posting an updated version in your Canvas course. **Suggested language** to include in your syllabus:

Due to the COVID-19 events, this course switched to online modality as of March 23, 2020. As a result, the assignments from March 23 to the end of the semester will be adjusted to reflect this change. Please note the changes made in the assignments as indicated by (highlighting? different font? etc.). The instructor reserves the right to make additional changes to the assignments or grading schema as needed to complete this course on time, and respond to university policies.

Assure them that we are all working hard to minimize the impact on their studies as we seek to mitigate the impact of this virus, and share how they might reach you—via Teams? email? Canvas Mailbox? Also recognize that students may have classes in three or more different platforms: Canvas, Teams and Zoom.

Faculty are reminded that syllabi for all courses must be posted in Canvas to migrate to Digital Measures. How-to-steps for loading syllabi are available under the *Getting Started* section at canvas.uta.edu.
