No Blackboard in Fall 2019, Last Chance for Summer Courses and Canvas Orientation

Faculty are reminded that **Blackboard will not be available** for teaching organized courses in Fall 2019, as it begins its decomissioning as part of the transition to Canvas.

In addition, the deadline to submit your course for <u>white glove</u> <u>migration</u> so that is is available for the **Summer 2019 session** is March 12. Faculty should contact their <u>college champion</u> to add their courses to the white glove list. This is the last chance to convert existing Blackboard summer courses to Canvas.

Faculty teaching Fall courses are invited to attend a Canvas orientation session to learn about the <u>migration</u> of their courses. The session will be held in **Nedderman Hall 100** and available on <u>Echo 360</u>.

All faculty teaching in Blackboard are encouraged to enroll in the "Growing with Canvas" online training course by contacting their <u>college champion</u>. Faculty that complete the pre-migration checklist are eligible for <u>White Glove service</u> in which Canvas migrates the Blackboard course content into Canvas.
