# Fall 2020 Planning

- Lists from colleges proposing changes in course modality are due to the Modality Subgroup on June 1. Faculty are encouraged to work with their department chairs to ensure that requests to teach fully online, in a hybrid format, or face-to-face are included in this preliminary list. Modality changes can be accommodated through the summer, as space allocations are made to ensure social distancing for F2F and hybrid courses.
- The Campus Repopulation Task Force is finalizing a plan for the phased return to campus of employees. The plan aligns with the Texas Governor's Executive Orders and CDC recommendations to protect our vulnerable populations while working to provide needed services as we prepare for Fall classes.
- The Logistics and Training Committee is developing a schedule of small group sessions with instructional designers to support faculty changing the modality of their courses. A schedule will be posted shortly in the CRTLE website at <u>crtleuta.org</u>.
- The <u>library</u> is making **PPEs** including cloth face masks for faculty and students. Academic departments and research laboratory groups may request additional face masks through <u>Environmental Health & Safety</u>.
- "Listening Sessions" are being planned for faculty and academic staff. A session held with associate deans and academic chairs on May 22 provided valuable feedback for the subgroups planning for Fall.

### **Order of SFS Responses**

In response to faculty requests, and as a result of complaints from students, the order of the Likert scale responses in the Student Feedback Surveys is now reversed. The answer options to the SFS questions ranged from strongly disagree to agree, leading to requests from students to redo the survey after mistakenly marking the wrong score. A highlighted banner has been added to the top of every SFS to inform students of the correct ordering: strongly agree to strongly disagree.
