Fall Planning

Trainings for Teaching Online

The first round of 2-week long training sessions for faculty teaching online this summer kicked off
Tuesday, May 5. Approximately 110 faculty signed up for technical training on Canvas, Teams and Echo 360; another 56 participants enrolled in a pedagogy course led by CRTLE. A second round of trainings kicks off May 18 for faculty that are either teaching this summer, or those that would like to develop an online course for Fall. OER Grants Available

Interim President Teik Lim encourages faculty to apply for The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) Open Educational Resource (OER) grants. These awards offer a maximum of \$25,000 to faculty or teams of faculty to develop new or substantially improve existing OER materials for one or more highenrollment Texas Core Curriculum (TCC) courses. The focus is on TCC courses that account for the majority of credits transferred among institutions. These grants should be matched with contributions from the institution or institutions (contributions can be in-kind).
