# Having Trouble with Cell Service on Campus?

Cell phone coverage varies widely across campus, especially indoors. We recommend utilizing UTA's Wi-Fi to improve cell phone service while on campus. "Wi-Fi Calling" is a way to call and text using the internet rather than traditional cell service. This feature is now offered by all major carriers and most cell phones are capable of calls and texts over Wi-Fi once enabled.

Quick cell phone setup: iPhone: Go to Settings > Phone > Wi-Fi Calling Make calls using Wi-Fi on iPhone

Android: Go to Settings > Connection > Wi-Fi Calling Turn on Wi-Fi Calling on Galaxy phones

### Updated TAP Request Form

The Technology Approval

Process Request (TAPREQ) form as been updated based on user feedback. More applications have also been added to the Pre-approved list . The TAPREQ process encapsulates policies and regulations from the University, System, and State related to the procurement and usage of Electronic Information Resources (EIR) related to accessibility, security, data safety and integrity, compatibility with infrastructure, and fiscal value. A TAPREQ is required for an application that is exposed to the public, is used by an employee to do their job, is prescribed for students to use as part of an academic program, or is used to process, transmit, or store university data.
