Ally Allies Needed

We are seeking faculty volunteers who wish to pilot a new tool to improve accessibility of their course material. <u>Ally</u> works through Canvas to provide students choices for accessing materials: HTML for improved reading on mobile phones; electronic Braille for the visually impaired, and audio for learning on the go. MyMav

UTA student focus groups have given a thumbs up to a new look for MyMav. Students can now access their information through a clean, <u>seamless design</u> allowing them to easily access their degree progress report, graduation application, financial aid statements and their courses. The Fluid MyMav Project will launch October 7. Faculty and advisors will be receiving additional information over the next month, as well as training and demonstrations. The <u>faculty MyMav</u> page will not change under this phase of the Fluid Project.



Faculty Senate Travel Funds

Tenured and tenure-track faculty are invited to apply for \$750 per academic year for travel for professional development or research presentations. <u>Applications</u> are reviewed monthly. Faculty Senate funds are available when other travel funds from the college, start-up or grant funds are insufficient. Last year, the Senate provided over \$30k in faculty support. Progress Report Grades in Canvas

Four- week grades or Progress Reports are required for <u>specific</u> <u>student groups</u> of students such as athletes and freshmen, and are <u>due</u> **Friday Sept. 20**. Faculty for all undergraduate courses are encouraged to use a syllabus quiz or <u>similar assignment</u> as a progress report to provide an early indication of student engagement. The progress report allows for faster intervention by the <u>Division of Student Success</u>. CDE's <u>training</u> page offers sessions on using the Canvas gradebook, and also offers <u>Canvas Open Lab Hours</u>.
