The Preaward team will kick it off with a discussion of how to complete a proposal review and a certification form called a "Blue Sheet," with extra emphasis and information on completing the indefinite delivery contract distribution form, as well as the multiple credit tab. Common reports that are available to the campus community will also be discussed. The Postaward team will finish the talk with details on a soon-to-be-released dashboard that will contain information about awards, effort, and budget, as well as information on useful Postaward reports available in Mentis.

ClinicalTrials.gov Enforcement

The National Institutes of Health has recently issued noncompliance letters for protocols that missed registration, submission, and posting deadlines on <u>ClinicalTrials.gov</u>. If you have not received a notice from the Office of Regulatory Services already, review our <u>guidance table</u> to understand the specific requirements based on IRB protocol type. Impacts of climate change on food production

A <u>new peer-reviewed study</u> from Behnaz Balmaki and Masoud Rostami shows that climate change has led to decreased pollen production from plants and less pollen diversity than previously thought, which could have a significant impact on food production. Many news outlets reported on the <u>story</u>, including <u>Yahoo</u>, <u>Philanthropy News Digest</u>, <u>Food Ingredients First</u>, and <u>The Cool Down</u>.

Fish evolve egg-laying habits in response to predators

Some species of fish can evolve their egg-laying habits in response to predators in the area to survive, according to new research from Matthew Walsh and Christopher Roden. The story was covered many news outlets, including Eurasia Review, Earth.com, Technology Networks, and Fish Focus.
