Through Jan. 12, 2025, each college is accepting applications for <u>Faculty Research Honors</u>, which recognize faculty members who have made significant contributions to their fields. The "Distinguished Record of Research or Creative Activity Award" recognizes a faculty member for achieving a distinguished record of research and scholarship or creative activity over an extended period. The "Outstanding Research Achievement or Creative Accomplishment Award" recognizes a faculty member for achieving a particularly important research or creative accomplishment during the past three years.

# Detailed bedbug gene analysis may improve pesticides

Thanks to new <u>UT Arlington research</u> by biologists Todd Castoe and Yannick Francioli, scientists now have a better genetic understanding of the common bedbug, providing new insight for those working to prevent bedbug infestation, develop remediation strategies, and track pesticide resistance, reported <u>Technology</u>. <u>Networks</u>, <u>Focus Technology</u>, <u>Washington DC News</u>, <u>Pest Control Technology</u>, <u>MSN News</u>, <u>Science Daily</u>, and <u>Phys.org</u>.
