## Cancer center taps UTA expert for survivor health study


A researcher at The University of Texas at Arlington is helping a leading national cancer center explore how wearable devices could help childhood cancer survivors avoid long-term health complications such as diabetes and heart disease. Yue Liao, assistant professor of kinesiology at UT Arlington, was invited by researchers at City of Hope, a National Cancer Institute-designated comprehensive cancer center, to contribute to a review article published in <u>Cancer</u>. ## NIH R15 AREA Program Eligibility Update

Effective **October 1**, **2025**, **UTA** will no longer be eligible to apply for the NIH Academic Research Enhancement Award (AREA/R15) program. This change is due to the university exceeding the NIH's eligibility threshold—receiving more than \$6 million in NIH funding in four of the last seven federal fiscal years. We encourage faculty to explore other NIH funding mechanisms and to consult <u>Pivot</u> for guidance on alternative opportunities.

## Regulatory Updates

# NOT-OD-25-138: Request for Information on Maximizing Research Funds by Limiting Allowable Publishing Costs

NIH Notice NOT-OD-25-138 is a Request for Information (RFI) seeking input on limiting publishing costs – like article processing charges – in NIH-funded projects. The aim is to ensure these costs don't overly burden grant budgets or disadvantage under-resourced researchers, while still supporting open access and equitable research dissemination.

#### NOT-OD-25-132: Supporting Fairness and Originality in NIH Research Applications

NIH will limit PIs to 6 new, renewal, resubmission, or revision research grant applications per calendar year, effective with the Sept 25, 2025 receipt date. The limit applies to all applications submitted as PI or MPI across all council rounds. T activity codes and R13 Conference Grants are excluded from this policy.

## NOT-OD-25-143: NIH Will Stop Posting Notices of Funding Opportunities in the NIH Guide for Grants and Contracts in FY2026

Starting in fiscal year 2026, NIH will post all funding opportunities exclusively on Grants.gov, ending their publication in the NIH Guide for Grants and Contracts. The Guide will still feature policy and informational notices, but applicants must

now use Grants.gov to find and track funding announcements.
