# **Capitalization Threshold Update**

The State Comptroller and the federal government have increased the capitalization threshold for certain assets at UTA to \$10,000. This change affects furniture, equipment, vehicles, boats, and aircraft. Additionally, UTA's controlled asset thresholds will be updated as follows:

- Firearms and computing devices: \$0-\$9,999.99
- Other controlled assets: \$500-\$9,999.99

#### Cost Centers and Plant Fund Projects

For transactions recorded on cost centers and plant fund projects, use the new \$10,000 threshold. Assets purchased or placed into service before Sept. 1, 2024, will follow the old cost threshold requirements.

#### Sponsored Projects

Due to indirect cost (IDC) implications, there is an additional level of complexity for sponsored projects. The current federally negotiated IDC rate agreement specifies that UTA cannot charge IDC on equipment costing more than \$5,000. This will not change until on or about Sept. 1, 2025. To avoid burdening budgets that did not account for IDC on items between \$5,000 and \$9,999.99:

- <u>Active Grant Projects</u>: Continue using capital equipment expense codes for equipment \$5,000 and over. Accounting Services will adjust entries for equipment costing between \$5,000 and \$10,000 to ensure accurate financial reporting as non-capitalized.
- Proposal Budgeting:
  - Non-Federal Projects: Use the \$10,000 threshold for budgeting effective immediately. Items below \$10,000 will be included in the supply line.
  - Federal Projects: Continue using the \$5,000 threshold until the new facilities and administrate rates are finalized. Items between \$5,000 and \$9,999.99 will be listed as equipment but not capitalized.

New projects will be set up according to the awarded budget, using either the \$5,000 or \$10,000 threshold as budgeted.

#### Faculty Honor Nominations Due Jan. 12

Through Jan. 12, 2025, each college is accepting applications for the <u>Faculty Research Honors</u> that recognize faculty members who have made significant contributions to their fields. The "Distinguished Record of Research or Creative Activity Award" recognizes a faculty member for achieving a distinguished record of research and scholarship or creative activity over an extended period. The "Outstanding Research Achievement or Creative Accomplishment Award" recognizes a faculty member for achieving a particularly important research or creative accomplishment during the past three years.

# **OGCS Hours and Proposal Submission**

The Office of Grant and Contract Services' (OCGS) hours of operation remain Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. If an investigator requires assistance after hours, prior approval is required from the <u>assistant vice</u> <u>president for research</u>. **Requests must include sufficient detail to justify an afterhours submission,** including the reason the proposal cannot be submitted during business hours. To guarantee a successful submission, proposals should be submitted to OGCS PreAward as early as possible, but at least three business days prior to submission. OGCS will accept, review, and submit proposals within three days of the deadline, but the level of review may be limited. The University reserves the right to withdraw, attempt to modify, or decline awards that were not given to OGCS prior to the three-day deadline and as a result do not conform to policy, procedures or guidelines. Proposals submitted with sufficient lead time benefit by receiving a thorough review of the proposal, including completion or review of administrative components, development or review of budget and budget justification, review and comment on the proposal taking into consideration responsiveness to sponsor requirements and guidelines, review of biosketch, and other requests. #### UTA biologist discovers new species of gecko

UT Arlington biologist Walter Schargel and colleagues <u>have published</u> their description of a new species of gecko found in Venezuela. ### Study links dating apps to increased risk of STIs
