NIH LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM

UTA researchers can learn more about the National Institutes of Health <u>Loan Repayment Program</u> (LRP) during the <u>LRP Technical Assistance Webinar</u> on Oct. 7 at 2 p.m. Applications for the NIH Extramural LRP are open now through Nov. 21, 2024. The webinar will explain more about <u>eligibility</u> and how awardees can receive \$100,000 in repayment of qualified educational debt over a two-year LRP period. To be eligible, applicants must be U.S. citizens, nationals, or permanent residents; possess an M.D., Ph.D., Pharm.D., Psy.D., D.O., D.D.S., D.M.D., D.P.M., D.C., N.D., O.D., D.V.M., or equivalent; have total qualified debt greater than or equal to 20 percent of their institutional base salary; and engage in qualified research.

UT System Renews Mexican Research Program

As part of the ConTex Collaborative Research Grants program, the UT System and Mexico's National Council for Humanities, Sciences, and Technologies (CONAHCYT) has signed an agreement of cooperation to continue academic collaborations between Mexico and the 14 UT System schools. Established in 2016, ConTex aims to foster academic and research collaborations between Texas and Mexico, promoting innovative and impactful research across borders. The program offers several funding opportunities to support bi-national research collaborations, including collaborative research grants of up to \$100,000 and doctoral fellowships.
