## **Handling Allegations of Foreign Interference**

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) has issued a new decision matrix for assessing potential foreign interference as part of its ongoing efforts to be transparent about its policies and procedures. The decision matrix builds on the detailed information already available and offers additional detail as to how NIH considers whether to contact institutions to request additional information.

### **New NSF Mentoring Plan Required**

The National Science Foundation (NSF) has changed the requirements for its mentoring plan, expanding it to require a plan for both *graduate students* and postdoctoral researchers supported on a project. The
