It's the best!

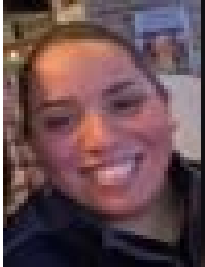
- Rewarding

 - Overall employment of social workers is projected to grow 11% from 2018 to 2028, *much faster* than the average for all occupations (BLS, 2020)
 - 17% growth for healthcare social work
 - 18% growth for MH/SUT

 - The median annual wage for social workers is \$50,470 (BLS, 2020)
