Memorandum of Understanding relating to the General Articulation Agreement between

The University of Texas at Arlington Social Work Department in the School of Social Work and

McLennan Community College Mental Health/Social Work Program in the Health Service & Education Department

I. Scope

a. Subject of Agreement -

McLennan Community College (hereafter, MCC) and The University of Texas at Arlington (hereafter UT Arlington) enter into the following general articulation agreement between MCC Mental Health/Social Work program and the Bachelor of Social Work program (BSW) at UT Arlington. MCC and UT Arlington may be referred to individually as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

b. Purpose of Agreement -

The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate the admission and academic transfer of students from the MCC Mental Health/Social Work program to the BSW program at UT Arlington.

c. Students -

The agreement is designed to serve only students enrolled in one of the approved degree plans: the Associate of Arts with a Field of Study in Social work degree, or the AA in General Academics with a Social Work Field of Study Certificate, or one of the Associate of Applied Science degrees in Mental Health at MCC.

d. Date of Effect -

The agreement will be in effect from the date on which the Parties have affixed their signatures. Review, revision and termination provisions are discussed below in Section III.

II. Understanding of the Parties

a. General Understandings, UT Arlington

During the period of this agreement, UT Arlington will allow MCC students to be enrolled in the UT Arlington Bachelor of Social Work program under these provisions and conditions:

- 1. MCC students must meet all general admissions requirements to transfer admission to UT Arlington and must apply by stated deadlines.
- 2. MCC Students must have completed the Associate in Arts with a Field of Study in Social Work (AA.FOS.SW) degree plan, the AA in General Academics with a Social Work Field of Study Certificate or the AA in General Academics with a Social Work Field of Study Certificate at MCC to in order to be eligible to receive transfer credit for the UT Arlington Social Work program for all the courses outlined in the MCC-UTA Pathway to the BSW document.

- 3. MCC students must have maintained no less than a cumulative 2.5 GPA in the courses taken at MCC.
- 4. MCC students must not have made any grade below a "C" in all course work that is to transfer to UT Arlington. Students who received in "D" or "F" grades will not be automatically excluded from the program but will not receive transfer credit for those courses.
- 5. MCC students transferring with the AA.FOS.SW, the AA in General Academics with a Social Work Field of Study Certificate, or the AA in General Academics with a Social Work Field of Study Certificate degree core complete, having taken MATH 1342 (Statistics), are not required to have a second college level Math class either from MCC or UT Arlington. MCC students transferring in core complete with any MCC MATH course other than MATH 1342 (Statistics) must still take UT Arlington MATH 1308 or equivalent statistics course. Students transferring in non-core complete must take a statistics course and another UT Arlington MATH course for a total of 6 hours of math.
- 6. MCC students who choose to pursue a Substance Use Treatment minor as a part of their BSW degree plan at UT Arlington, may transfer MCC Mental Health/Social Work WECM courses to fulfill all the required hours except a 9-credit hour practicum to be completed at UT Arlington. These courses are listed on the attached MCC to UT Arlington Pathway to the BSW. Additional MCC courses may also be accepted to fulfill requirements for General Electives.
- 7. UT Arlington will provide faculty/staff to serve as a contact for MCC students wishing to enroll in this program and who have questions concerning their potential enrollment. UT Arlington will provide admission and financial aid information and be available to assist students with the transfer process.

b. General Understandings, MCC

During the period of this agreement, MCC will:

- Advise MCC students wishing to enter the UT Arlington BSW degree program that they must complete the application process for admission to UT Arlington, meet any required deadline posted, submit payment of the application fee, and submit official transcripts from all colleges attended in order to be considered for admission.
- 2. Advise MCC students of requirements to successfully enter the BSW program at UT Arlington by meeting all GPA, course grade requirements and course completion requirements.
- 3. Provide opportunities for UT Arlington to share information concerning this agreement with MCC AA.FOS.SW degree, Social Work FOS Certificate or the AA in General Academics with a Social Work Field of Study Certificate seeking students (ex: presentations by UT Arlington faculty/staff in MCC SW classes, sharing of AA.FOS.SW student directory information each long semester for the purposes of electronic contact and mailing information about this agreement and transfer

opportunities at UT Arlington, recruitment tabling opportunities, and providing UT Arlington information during MCC SW student organization meetings);

c. Mutual Understandings

- Participation of qualified students in the program will be permitted in compliance with applicable federal, state, and local nondiscrimination laws and regulations. In particular, UT Arlington and MCC will not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, gender, age, sexual orientation, marital status, disability, military discharge, or veteran status in any area of employment or in services to their students.
- 2. Both institutions will maintain their accreditation with regional accrediting associations and other accreditation currently in existence pertaining to the degree programs.
- 3. Each institution will attempt to encourage and maintain a high degree of cooperation between their support staffs in the operation of this agreement.
- 4. Any waiver by either Party of any term or provision of this agreement at any time will not constitute a waiver of any other or all terms and provisions. Any waiver of any part of a provision of this agreement at any one time will not constitute a waiver for all times.
- Both Parties will comply with the Family Education rights and Privacy Act (FERPA/Buckley Amendment) in the handling of educational records of students enrolled in their programs.
- 6. Both Parties will work together to maintain a current and accurate MCC to UTA Pathway to the BSW crosswalk of courses.
- 7. Both Parties will share students' information, as allowed by law, to measure the success of the agreement provisions and student performance.

III. Review, Amendment and Termination

- a. All Parties are committed to the concept of a long-standing agreement. This agreement will be amended when applicable programs are added, deleted, or significantly modified. Amendments may take the form of letters signed by the signatories below or their designated representatives. This agreement is effective for two years and will be reviewed at least annually or at any time at the request of either Party. Either Party may terminate its role in the agreement by written notice to the other Party at least one long semester before such termination is to become effective.
- IV.
