## Postdoctoral Fellowship in Alcohol and Other Substance Abuse Research

The University of Michigan Addiction Center, a multidisciplinary program is seeking PhD and MD applicants for its National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA)-funded T32 alcohol and substance abuse postdoctoral research training program. The UM Addiction Center (https://medicine.umich.edu/dept/psychiatry/programs/addiction-center) is located within the Department of Psychiatry, and it currently houses 24 projects addressing issues pertaining to the etiology, prevention, course, clinical manifestations, and treatment of alcohol and other substance use/misuse, alcohol/drug problems, and co-occurring disorders. The University provides an unusually strong methodological infrastructure for trainees, and a research environment that is rich in collaborations. Faculty from the Departments of Psychiatry, Psychology, Statistics, Human Genetics, Pharmacology, Emergency Medicine, the Schools of Public Health, Social Work and Nursing, the Institute for Social Research, and the Institute for Healthcare Policy and Innovation, and a number of other university-wide Centers and Institutes provide a broad range of mentored research opportunities.

Research activities are focused in six major areas:

- Developmental Psychopathology and Genetics
- Prevention and Early Intervention
- Health Services Research
- Brain function and Neurophysiology
- Treatment
- Translational and Implementation Research

The NIAAA T32 Postdoctoral Research Training Program, now in its 29<sup>th</sup> year, is designed to provide multidisciplinary training to prepare future scientists to conduct research to:

- Develop and test effective methods to effect change through improved approaches to treatment and indicated prevention
- Develop and test models to disseminate knowledge of effective interventions to diverse populations
- Elucidate the process of changes in drinking and other drug use behaviors

The University of Michigan is committed to promoting diversity in its T32 Training program, and particularly encourages applications from underrepresented minorities. Fellows must be US citizens or permanent residents with a PhD or MD degree. Appointments typically are for two years of training although a third-year appointment is sometimes available. Salaries are commensurate with prior postdoctoral experience and NRSA regulations. Applications will be considered as received for appointments in the 2021-2022 year.
