To apply for field, students pay a one-time fee for Tevera that covers the entire MSW (\$225 through Tevera or \$272 through the bookstore; paying through the bookstore allows the fee to be charged to student's financial aid); Block Field is available as well (SOCW 5585 & 5385) during which students complete field in one semester instead of 2.

³ Students must finish their foundation courses or have Advanced Standing (with BSW) before taking this course.

⁵ If Thesis Option is selected, student takes SOCW 5396 in place of second elective
