REQUIRED:

Introductory Practice Course-SOCW 5312

Practice Options: must take any TWO from the six listed. SOCW 5312 must be taken at the same time or before any of the Practice Option courses.

Human Behavior and the Social Environment Course - SOCW 5327

Advanced Policy Course-SOCW 5328

Research Course - SOCW 5323

Advanced Field Placement: Students are required to complete SOCW 5312 before taking advanced field. A 3.0 cumulative GPA is required to take advanced field. May take SOCW 5482 then SOCW 5483 in consecutive semesters (SPLIT) or take both SOCW 5485 and SOCW 5486 as a BLOCK in one semester.

Capstone Course Options: Students must choose to take the Integrative Seminar or Thesis Option.

<u>Integrative Seminar</u> – This option must be taken in the final program semester concurrently with 5483 or after completing block of SOCW 5485 & SOCW 5486.

Thesis Option – This option may be taken in place of one elective AND the Integrative Seminar.

ELECTIVES:

Students with Advanced Standing must take 3 social work electives, while students without Advanced Standing must take 2 social work electives to complete their program of study and the number of required credit hours to graduate. The suggested electives above are those that the faculty STRONGLY recommend as supporting your development in this area of specialization. However, other electives may be considered. Any elective must be chosen from the advanced level social work courses offered (check for any applicable prerequisites).

Students may choose to add a certificate to their program of study, and should speak with an Academic Advisor regarding certificate options
