DSW program launch Spring 2026

The School of Social Work is preparing to launch a new online Doctor of Social Work program, expected to begin in Spring 2026, pending final approval from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

The program aims to bridge the gap between practice, leadership, and teaching in the field of social work by providing a curriculum that emphasizes real-world application, innovative teaching methods, and leadership training tailored specifically for social work educators. equipping professionals with advanced skills in education and leadership.

"DSW programs cater to experienced social workers who aspire to transition into academia, teaching the next generation while bringing real-world expertise into the classroom," said Dr. Karen Magruder, DSW Program Director.

Professor interviews founder of African American Museum

Students in a social work macro practice course recently had the chance to learn outside the usual classroom format during a guest interview organized by Dr. Kelli Rogers, social work assistant professor of practice.

Dr. Rogers interviewed Dr. Harry Robinson Jr., longtime president of the African American Museum in Dallas Feb. 12.

She said the interview is part of an ongoing effort to connect course content with real-world experiences and community-based practice.

"Often students are listening to lectures or reviewing material from their textbooks," Dr. Rogers said. "I wanted to give them something a little different—a chance to see how these concepts play out in real life."

Link between body image, suicide ideation in teenagers

A new study from the University of Texas at Arlington sheds light on a distressing reality: Adolescents who perceive themselves as overweight are more likely to consider self-harm than those who do not, irrespective of their actual weight. This revelation challenges our understanding of mental health risks and underscores the urgent need for intervention in how young people perceive their bodies.
