Students participate in organized activities (in English) for approximately 8 hours per day. Weekends are free to explore the surrounding areas and other Italian cities. The academic component includes **lectures**, **workshops**, **seminars**, **debates**, **field visits**, **social and cultural activities**, **tours**, **and a one-day excursion** to the surrounding mountains and museum visits. **Cost is approximately \$450** and includes accommodation, meals (except for breakfast), bus pass and social activities.
