



REGISTRATION TIMETABLE SUMMER + FALL 2024

If your GPA is 2.0 and higher:

- If you have 90+ hours you can start registering on 04/03
- If you have 60+ hours you can start registering on 04/05
- If you have 30+ hours you can start registering on 04/08

If your GPA is lower than 2.0 and under academic probation:

- you can start registrar on 04/12

Registration is open to all students on 04/17

ADVISING PRIOR TO REGISTRATION

All University Studies (UNIS) students below **required** to advised by a UNIS academic advisor prior to registration *each semester*.

- 1) **You are senior student with 90 hours and above.**
- 2) **Your GPA is under 2.0**
- 3) **You are returning to UTA.**

- Students can check for their advising holds and other holds in the Student Center of [MyMav](#). The advising hold must be released by your academic advisor before you can register.
- Typically, the advising period for the Spring term opens in October, and for the Summer and Fall terms in March.

Other UNIS student with GPA above 2.0, your holds will be removed, and you can enroll regularly without advisement required. However, if you need assistance, you can contact your adviser through email, virtual meetings, or drop-in's time.

PICKING CLASSES

Students will be provided with a **MAP** showing their academic progress and a **list of course options (Last section of this page)** to be able to pick out classes that match degree requirements. Every University Studies student will have a different MAP depending on their primary and secondary content areas and remaining credits. In your advising meeting you will be instructed on how to use these documents.

REGISTRATION INSTRUCTION

Registration at UT Arlington is done online using [MyMav](#). The current term's Registration Timetable gives the exact dates and times for registration. The [Schedule of Classes](#) is updated for the Spring term in mid-October, and in mid-March for the Summer and Fall terms. Students log in to [MyMav](#) to register.

The system will not allow students to enroll into classes/sessions if they do not meet the requirements below:

- X **Prerequisites** (a specific course or test score is needed prior to taking this one)
- X **Courses only designated for Accelerated Online (AO) or Nursing AO students** (these courses are reserved for a particular cohort of students in these programs, and are not open to all students)
- X **Department Consent** (The department is reserving seats in this class for particular majors, cohorts, student populations. You may contact the advisor in the department offering the class to ask for permission to enroll. It is at their discretion. The University Studies department cannot provide students with permission to enroll in department restricted classes.

All courses have multiple sections but a few of those sections are reserved for a specific student population or cohort. If you are not in that population/cohort, you cannot take that section of the class. **Pick another section that is *open to all students*.** The closer we get to classes starting the sections open to all students will fill, and only restricted sections will be left on the list so choose early.

FILTERING OPTIONS

If you would like to filter your search, you have the option to do so when you have typed in the subject you are searching and hit enter. Once that is done, you will see filters on the left-hand side of the results page.
