**AGREEMENT
ON
DUAL CREDIT COURSES OFFERED BY
THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT ARLINGTON**

In accordance with and under the authority of Texas Education Code Sections 61.027 and 61.076 and the Rules and Regulations of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, high school students may enroll in university courses and receive simultaneous academic credit from both the university and the high school. In order to ensure the quality of dual credit courses and to facilitate communications and understanding between the Birdville Independent School District (BISD) and The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA), the following provisions are agreed to by UTA and BISD with regard to dual credit.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

High School juniors or seniors can participate in The University of Texas at Arlington Dual Credit Program by demonstrating college readiness and direct admission by satisfying **one** the following:

- Rank in the top 20% of your current class
- PSAT score of at least 480 on Evidenced-based reading and writing and 530 on Math
- PLAN composite score of at least 23
- 3.5 unweighted grade point average (4.0 scale),
- SAT score of at least 1070 Critical Reading + Math (test taken prior to March 2016) or SAT score of at least 1140 Critical Reading + Math (test taken during or after March 2016)
- ACT composite score of at least 23

Additionally, students must satisfy the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) requirement for college readiness by achieving the minimum passing standards on the TSI Assessment Test, or equivalent.

- Equivalent methods to satisfy the TSI requirement include:
 - Achieving an SAT I score of at least 1070 (Critical Reading + Math) with scores of at least 500 in both Math and Critical Reading; or
 - An ACT composite score of at least 23 with scores of at least 19 in both Math and English; or

High school students applying for admission to the Dual Credit Program must submit the following:

- Application for admission and a \$60 application fee
- Official high school transcript indicating junior or senior standing
- Official SAT, ACT or other scores (listed above) to demonstrate college readiness
- Completed Dual Credit Program agreement signed by the high school representative, the student, and the student's parent or guardian

As of September 1, 2013, incoming Texas college students under 22 years old must be immunized against bacterial meningitis before they enroll in an institution of higher education.

Students enrolling in certain dual credit courses must meet university course prerequisites unless prior prerequisite waivers have been obtained. For instance, students enrolling in English 1302 must have completed or been awarded credit for English 1301.

FACULTY QUALIFICATIONS

The instructor for a dual credit course will be employed by The University of Texas at Arlington. The instructor must meet credential requirements of UTA and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

All classes will be held on the UTA campus or taken by Distance Education. Classes are open to all UT Arlington students.

GRADING CRITERIA/PROCEDURES

At the end of each semester, UTA will provide a grade roster with letter and numeric grades to the high school principal for dual credit courses.

Students may request an official transcript from UTA for a fee of \$7 per copy.

The UTA courses offered for dual credit, regardless of format, follow the same syllabus, course outline, grading procedure, and other academic policies. Letter grades are given in accordance with academic policies printed in the university catalog and placed on the university transcript.

BISD will record the student's official grade on the student's report card and the final grade on the student's Academic Achievement Record. The student must earn a grade of 70 or higher in order to earn high school credit.

TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDIT

The University of Texas at Arlington is a fully accredited institution and basic academic courses are transferable. However, since each university has its own policy regarding the transferability of courses, each student is strongly advised to check with the university to which he or she plans to attend if other than UTA, to determine the transferability of the UTA courses.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS/SERVICES

Students enrolled in dual credit courses --

- Are expected to follow university rules and regulations
- Are classified as undeclared majors
- Are limited to two (2) UTA courses each fall, spring, or summer semester while concurrently enrolled in high school
- Receive academic advising for course registration at the UTA Honors Academy Dual Credit Program

FEES

The University of Texas at Arlington fee waivers for students enrolled in Honors Academy dual credit courses result in a price per course lower than that paid by other UTA students. Specifically, students enrolled in a three (3) credit hour course pay \$150* (\$50 per semester hour). Additionally, students are responsible for parking fees, specific departmental fees (including \$37.50 distance education course fee, if applicable) and books.

In accordance with and under the authority of Texas Education Code Sections 61.027 and 61.076 and the Rules and Regulations of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, high school students may enroll in University courses and receive simultaneous academic credit from both the University and the high school. In order to ensure the quality of dual credit courses and to facilitate communications and understanding between Crowley Independent School district (CISD) and the University of Texas at Arlington (UTA), the following provisions are agreed to by UTA and CISD with regard to dual credit.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

High school juniors or seniors who have earned a minimum composite SAT-I scored of 1000, PSAT score of 100, or ACT score of 21 are eligible to participate if they have passed the TASP test or are exempt from TASP testing requirements.

High School students applying for admission to dual credit courses must submit the following:

- Application for admission and a \$25.00 application fee.
- Official high school transcript indicating junior or senior standing.
- Official SAT-I, PSAT or ACT scores (scores posted on an official high school transcript and mailed directly from the high school are acceptable).
- Completed Early Admission Program agreement signed by the high school principal, the student, and the student's parent or guardian.
- Upon high school graduation, a final high school transcript showing rank-in-class and graduation date.

Students enrolling in certain dual credit courses must meet university course prerequisites unless prior prerequisite waivers have been obtained. For instance, students enrolling in English 2309 must have completed or been awarded credit for English 1301 and 1302. In some cases waivers of prerequisites will be granted upon agreement by CISD counseling staff and UTA English Department.

FACULTY QUALIFICATIONS

The instructor for a dual credit course will be employed by The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA). The instructor must meet credential requirements of UTA and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

GRADING CRITERIA/PROCEDURES

Prior to graduation from high school, The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA) transcript with courses taken for dual credit will be released to the student and, upon written request of the student, the transcript will be released to the student's high school.

Upon graduation from high school, students must submit an official high school transcript before any of the UTA transcripts will be released to other colleges or universities.

The UTA courses offered for dual credit, regardless of format, follow the same syllabus, course outline, grading procedure, and other academic policies as other UTA courses. Letter grades are given in accordance with academic policies printed in the university catalog and placed on the university transcript.

At the end of each semester, the UTA registrar will provide a grade roster with numeric grades to the high school principal for dual credit courses.

Official grades will be provided at the dates specified to meet grade-reporting dates as required by the school district and the University Interscholastic League (UIL).

CISD will record the student's official grade on the student's report card each six weeks and the final grade on the student's Academic Achievement Record. The student must earn a grade of 70 or higher in order to earn high school credit. Dual credit courses will not be used to calculate grade point averages.

TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDIT

The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA) is a fully accredited institution and basic academic courses are transferable. However, since each university has its own policy regarding the transferability of courses, each student is strongly advised to check with the university which he or she plans to attend, if other than UTA, to determine the transferability of the UTA courses.

STUDENTS EXPECTATIONS/SERVICES

Students enrolled in dual credit courses –

- Are expected to follow university rules and regulations
- Are classified as undeclared majors
- Are limited to two (2) University of Texas at Arlington (UTA) courses each fall, spring, and summer semester while concurrently enrolled in high school
- Receive academic advising for course registration

FEES


The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA) fee waivers for students enrolled in dual credit courses result in a price per course lower than fees customarily paid by other students pursuant to UTA policy. In addition to this amount, a reduced Distance Education fee (currently \$28) will be charged for all Internet-based Distance Education courses. The actual price paid per course (exclusive of fees being waived) will be those established by UTA policy for each semester.

JOINT PLANNING

The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA) will submit only those courses for dual credit that specifically meet the mandates of the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) as specified by the Texas Education Agency (TEA). In order to assist the district in determining compatibility with the TEKS and local needs, UTA will submit course descriptions at least one semester in advance of offering a course.

Annual renewal of this agreement is automatic unless one institution notifies the other in writing of its desire to modify the dual credit agreement.



In order to ensure the quality of dual credit courses and to facilitate communications and understanding between Harmony Science Academy (HSA) and The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA), the following provisions are agreed to by UTA and HSA with regard to dual credit.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

High School juniors or seniors can participate in the UT Arlington Dual Credit/Early Admission Program by demonstrating college readiness through one of the following:

- An SAT I score of at least 1070 (Critical Reading + Math) with scores of at least 500 in both Math and Critical Reading.
- An ACT composite score of at least 23 with scores of at least 19 in both Math and English.
- TAKS scores of at least 2200 in both Math and English/language arts and a TAKS Essay score of at least 3.

If a student does not meet any of the above requirements they can also become eligible by achieving the minimum passing standards under the provisions of the Texas Success Initiative (TSI). This provision requires the student to take one of the following approved testing instruments:

- ACCUPLACER offered by The College Board.
- Texas Higher Education Assessment (THEA) offered by National Evaluation Systems, Inc.
- ASSET or COMPASS offered by ACT.

High school students applying for admission to the Dual Credit/Early Admission must submit the following:

- Application for admission and a \$50 application fee
- Official high school transcript indicating junior or senior standing
- Official SAT, ACT or other scores (listed above) to demonstrate college readiness
- Completed Early Admissions Program agreement signed by the high school principal, the student, and the student's parent or guardian

As of Jan. 1, 2012, incoming Texas college students under 30 years old must be immunized against bacterial meningitis before they enroll in an institution of higher education.

Students enrolling in certain dual credit courses must meet university course prerequisites unless prior prerequisite waivers have been obtained. For instance, students enrolling in English 1302 must have completed or been awarded credit for English 1301.

Addendum I Engineering

Qualified Mansfield ISD students are eligible for selected College of Engineering courses for dual credit to meet high school graduation requirements and earn university degree credit. Qualified students who do not need the courses for high school graduation requirements may take the same classes concurrently with their high school courses but not as dual credit students.

2. Complete a sequence of Project Lead The Way courses (PLTW), with a "B" or better including two foundation courses:
 - Introduction to Engineering Design (IED)
 - Principles of Engineering (POE)One of the specialization courses:
 - Aerospace Engineering (AE)
 - Biotechnical Engineering (BE)
 - Civil Engineering and Architecture (CEA)
 - Computer Integrated Manufacturing (CIM)
 - Digital Electronics (DE)And the Capstone Course
 - Engineering Design and Development (EDD)
3. Are prepared to begin Math 1426, with Calculus I (as determined by score on the UTA math Placement Test).

Addendum II
Criminology Criminal Justice (CRCJ)
