## The University of Texas at Arlington Dual Credit Program Agreement

The Dual Credit Program at the University of Texas at Arlington is available to applicants who wish to begin their college education following their sophomore or junior year of high school. Applicants who satisfy admission requirements may enroll in university classes while being concurrently enrolled in high school. University credit is awarded for courses that are completed with grades of A, B, C, or D. The Office of the Registrar keeps official transcripts that indicate the department, course number, course title, grade and semester hours earned. Students may request an official copy of their University transcript after their first semester or summer session. International students currently enrolled in U.S. high schools are eligible for admission as Dual Credit students.

High School juniors or seniors can participate in the UT Arlington Dual Credit Program by demonstrating college readiness through one of the following:

- A rank in the top $20 \%$ of your current class, or
- a PSAT score of at least 480 on Evidenced-based reading and writing, and 530 on Math, or
- a PLAN composite score of at least 23 , or
- a 3.5 unweighted grade point average ( 4.0 scale), or
- an SAT score of at least 1070 in combined Critical Reading + Math (test taken prior to March 2016) or an SAT score of at least 1140 in combined Evidence-based Reading + Math (test taken during or after March 2016), or
- an ACT composite score of at least 23 .

Additionally, students must satisfy the Texas Success Initiative requirement for college readiness (TSI) by achieving the minimum passing standards on the TSI Assessment Test or equivalent.
Equivalent methods to satisfy the TSI requirement include:

- Achieving an SAT score of at least 1070 in Critical Reading and Math (with a minimum score of 500 in Critical Reading and 500 in Math) if taken prior to March 2016, or an SAT score of at least 480 on the Evidenced-based Reading and 530 on the Math, if taken after March 2016; or
- An ACT composite score of at least 23 with scores of at least 19 in both Math and English.

A student who is admitted under the Dual Credit Program:

- May enroll in at most two (2) UTA academic courses each fall or spring semester while being concurrently enrolled in high school, or up to two (2) courses per session during the summer
- Must follow University rules and regulations
- Is classified as an Undeclared major
- Will be advised by the Division of Student Success Dual Credit Academy located in Ransom Hall, (817) 272-3140
- Is not eligible for financial aid

An Undeclared major designation is intended to enhance advising. Students may select courses that will apply to their desired major. Following graduation from high school, students may change their major.

Students planning to attend UT Arlington after high school graduation must submit an update application and official high school transcript for Admission consideration.

High School counselors should verify that a student who participates in a college curriculum will not be disqualified from a desired University Interscholastic League (UIL) competition.
